

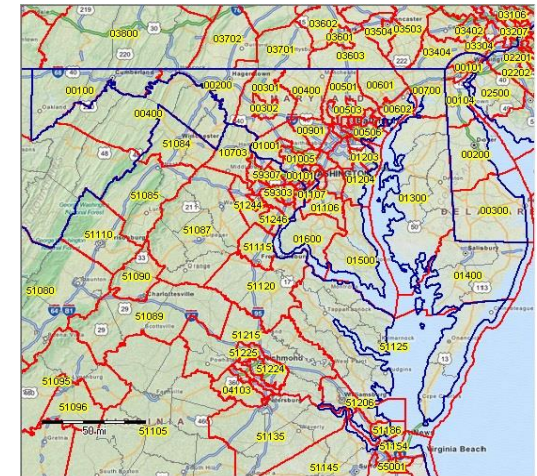

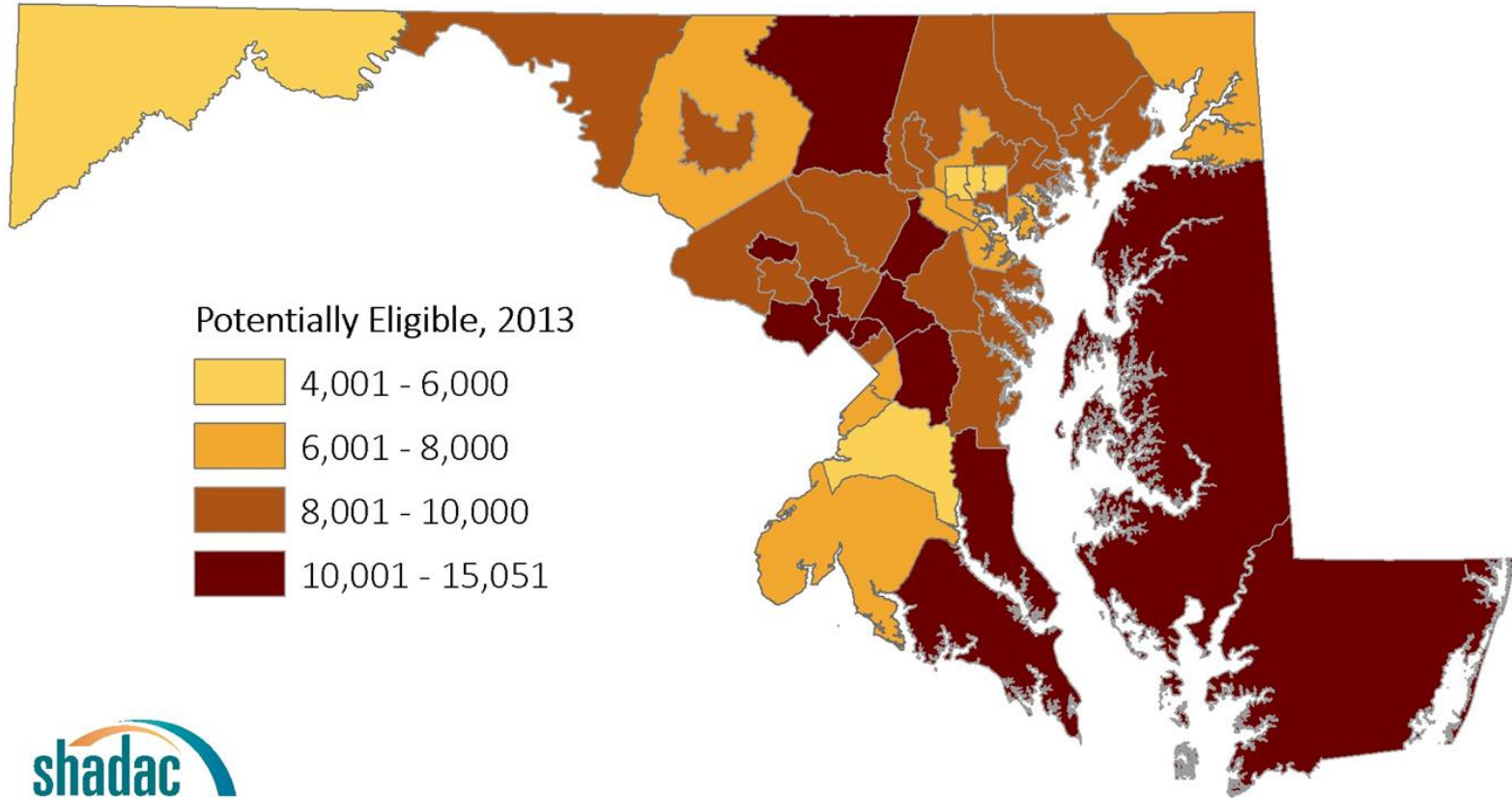

# ANALYSIS OF REMAINING ELIGIBLE

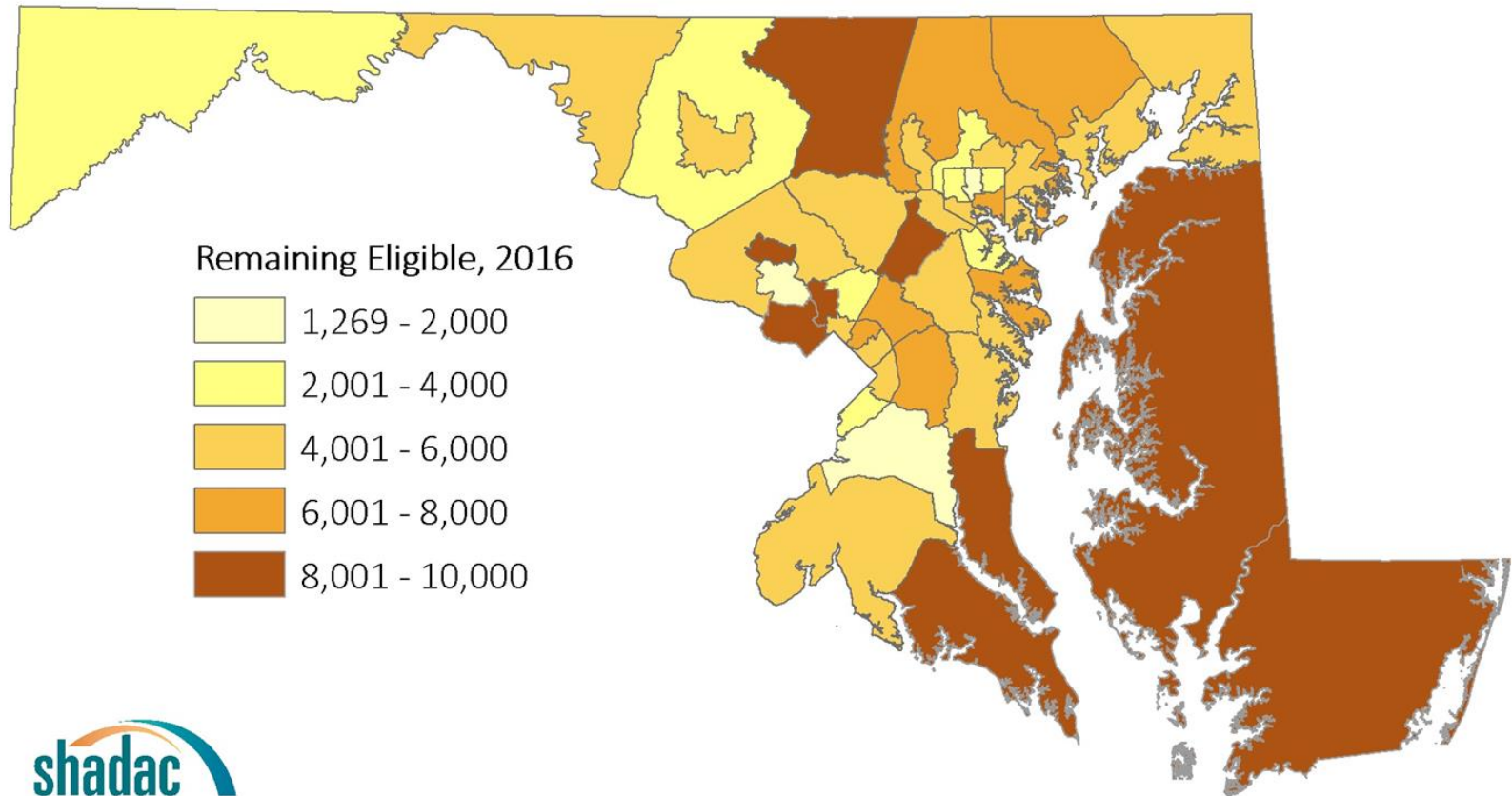
- **State Health Access Data Assistance Center (SHADAC)**, based at the University of Minnesota, analyzed the distribution of Maryland's remaining uninsured population in 2015 and 2016.
- MHBE provided enrollments by ZIP code. SHADAC applied that to Census areas known as **PUMAs (Public Use Microdata Areas)**.
- SHADAC **excluded** estimates of **unauthorized immigrants and uninsured people with available employer-sponsored coverage** — who would not be eligible for financial assistance.
- SHADAC **included** adults under 65 with **non-group coverage** since those above 138% of Federal Poverty Level could be eligible for marketplace assistance.

# TAKEAWAYS

- Population eligible for Maryland Health Connection coverage trimmed by **40% in three years.**
- Estimated **240,000** remain eligible of original **405,000**
- Maryland achieved one of the **fastest growth rates** year-over-year of any state in 2016. (*Source: ACA Signups.net*)
- **Including Medicaid, 1 million+** Marylanders have been covered through Maryland Health Connection.
- **SHADAC's** analysis is a high-level indicator — not an absolute accounting — of remaining eligible in an area.
